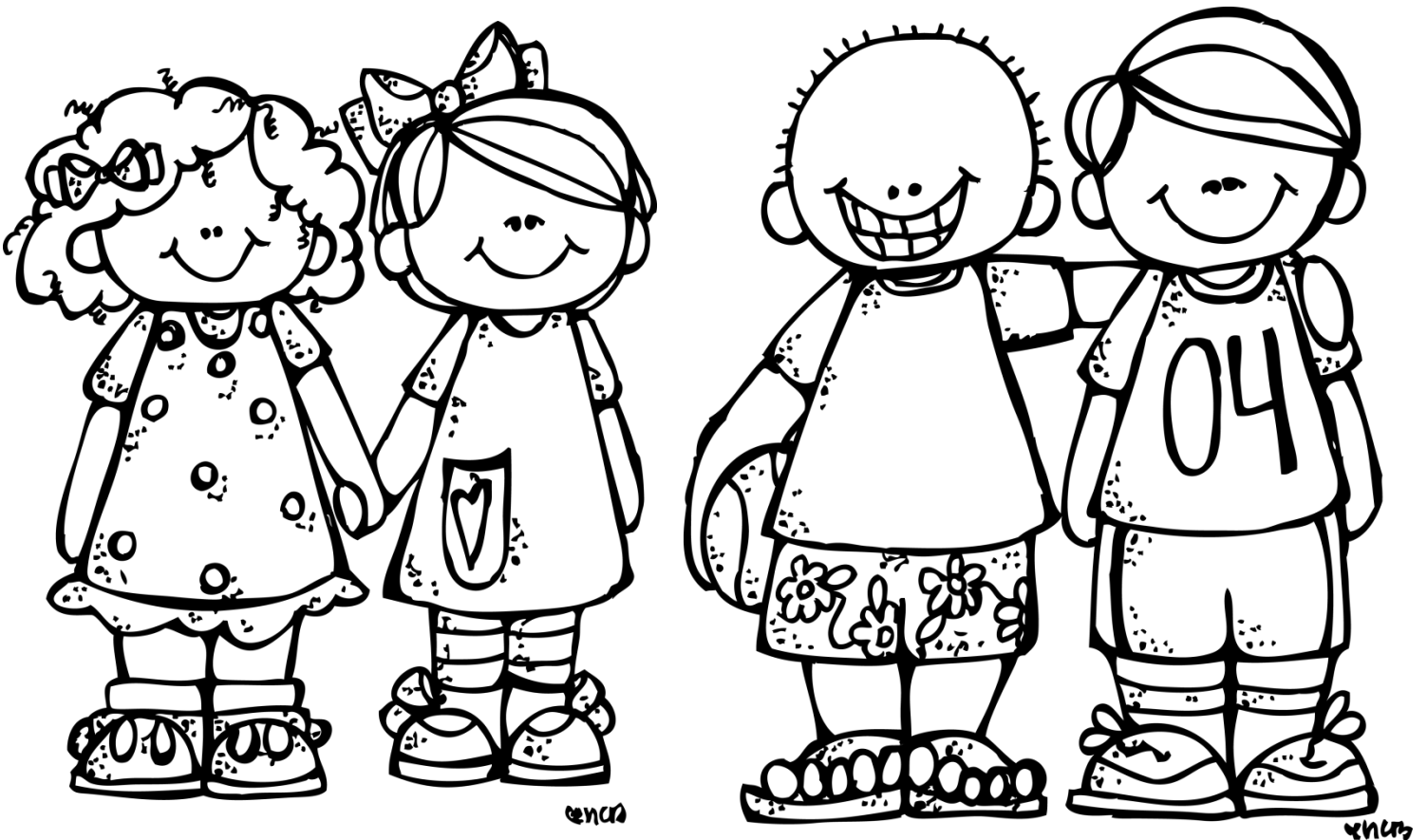

Dear Families,

This summer, Riverview School will once again offer a summer school program. Riverview's summer school program will run 19 days beginning Monday, July 23 through Thursday, August 16. The summer school day will run 8:15 am until 11:45 am.

Students and parents are advised to read the Riverview Summer School Programming Guide carefully. Please give attention to the grade level requirements for each class. Your child should sign up for the grade level they will be in for the 2018-19 school year. Students will have the opportunity to register for four different classes that spark their interest. You will receive notification and confirmation of selected courses in June.

Registration begins May 7, 2018 and will extend through June 5, 2018. Registration for non-resident students (who are not currently open-enrolled to Riverview) will begin on Monday, May 21, 2018, so it is important for district residents to register early. All classes are filled on a first come, first serve basis using enrollment forms. All courses are subject to class size and availability of staff. A course may be cancelled due to lack of enrollment.

It is important to the success of this program that students honor the commitment to attend the classes for which they have registered. Please notify the school at least one (1) week in advance if an unforeseen circumstance prevents your child from attending. If you know in advance of vacation dates that will cause your child to miss summer school, please let the school know as soon as possible.

## Please Note:

- Teaching staff will be in the building on the days of summer school from 8:00 am to noon.
- Summer school hours for students will be 8:15 am to 11:45 am. Please note that we have allowed for travel time in our schedule this year. We will enter the building at 8:15 and walk to our first classes which will start at 8:20 am.
- Students attending summer school are restricted to the room and area in which their classes are taking place.
- Students are expected to adhere to all the rules and policies that have been adopted by the school for the regular school year. Continued noncompliance to rules will result in a dismissal from summer school.
- Students are expected to dress according to the weather. An attempt will be made to hold classes in the air-conditioned parts of the building during the summer session.
- Summer school drop-off and pick-up will be located on School Street. Students will enter/exit through Door #8.
- Please inform the school nurse, in writing, if your child has any type of food or environmental allergy.
- If your child has a health concern that may impact their participation in summer school, please contact the school nurse no later than the first day of summer school.
- A snack time will be scheduled daily for students between the second and third session class. Please send a snack with your child each day.

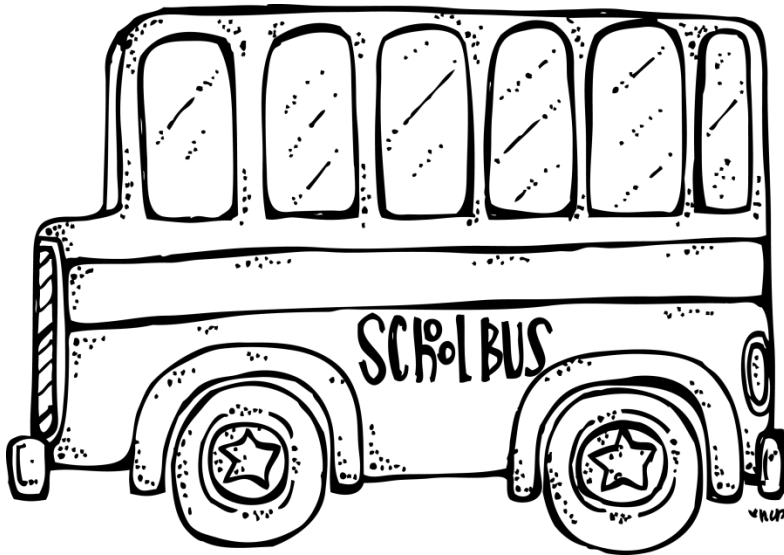
