Riverview Summer School 2014

Welcome to Riverview School's Summer School Program for 2014. Our school is offering a summer school program to the Silver Lake-Salem Community in June and July. We have adopted the following philosophy statement for Riverview's Summer Extended Learning Program:

Riverview School offers summer school programs as an opportunity to extend learning for children and to provide enriching school experiences beyond the regular school year. The focus of the summer school will be to provide a positive, stimulating experience for each participant through small classes which will allow for more individualized instruction.

All courses/programs have been designed to meet a wide variety of interests and needs. Along with academic focused classes, there will be a separate set of classes/programs that will focus on enrichment which are intended to teach students skills in areas other than Reading and Math. All students will have the opportunity to participate in these classes as well. Classes are planned to extend thinking, expand understanding, and challenge our students.

Riverview is excited to announce another Summer School opportunity for our students. "Jump Start" Summer School will be held August 11th – 21st from 8:30-11:30 AM. The focus of "Jump Start" will be to prepare students for a successful 2014-15 school year. Students will focus on reading, writing, and math instruction that will promote success during the 2014-15 school year. Students will be grouped by grade level. Enrollment in the August "Jump Start" Summer School program will be teacher recommendation ONLY. Class size will be limited to approximately (10) students per grade level. Students recommended for the "Jump Start" program will be notified by mail in early May. There will be no cost for the "Jump Start" Summer School session and we are very confident the "Jump Start" program will give students the tools to be successful in the 2014-15 school year. If you have any questions, please contact Mr. Gendron.

Students and parents are advised to read the Riverview Summer School brochure carefully. Some enrichment courses may be free, while others may have a higher fee.

Please note:

- Teaching staff will be in the building on the days of summer school from 8:00 A.M. to 12:15 P.M. Parents wishing to contact teaching staff should plan on calling between 8:00-8:15 A.M. or 12:00-12:15 P.M.
- Summer School hours for students are from 8:15-12:00 P.M.
- Students attending a class are restricted to the room and area in which their class is taking place.
- Bikes may be ridden to and from school, but riding around school grounds during class sessions is prohibited.
- For health and safety, students should not ride skateboards while on school grounds.
- Students are expected to adhere to all the rules and policies that have been adopted by the school for the regular school year.
- Students are expected to dress according to the weather. An attempt will be made to hold classes in the air-conditioned parts of the building during the summer session.
- **Students should sign up for courses for the grade level they will be enrolled in during the 2014-15 School Year.**
- Transportation is not provided. Transportation to and from summer school sessions will be the responsibility of parents. **Unless you have school business in the main office, please pick up and drop off your student along School Street. The students will not be able to enter the building until 8:10 A.M. and need to be picked up promptly at 12:00 P.M. Students should meet each day on the elementary playground – summer school teachers will pick the students up each day from the playground.**
- Please inform your child's teacher, in writing, if your child has any type of food or environmental allergy.
- If your child has a health concern that may impact their participation in summer school, please contact your child's summer school teacher or the office no later than the first day of summer school.
- **Refunds-** No refunds will be given after June 16th, 2014.

Registration:

Registration begins on April 7th, 2014, and will extend through May 16th, 2014. Registration for non-resident students will begin on Tuesday, April 22nd, so it is important for District Residents to apply early. Late registration will be accepted through June 6th for courses that have not been filled. Please complete the registration form at the end of this brochure, and return to the school office with your registration fee. The registration varies for each class. The registration fee is designed to cover the cost of consumable materials. All fees are listed with the brief course descriptions.

- All courses are subject to class size and availability of staff. Some courses may be cancelled due to lack of enrollment. Students are assigned to classes he/she signed up for unless otherwise notified. **Class lists will be posted on June 6, 2014 on the Kindergarten doors.**
- It is important to the success of this program that students honor the commitment to attend the classes for which they have registered. Please notify the school at least one (1) week in advance if an unforeseen circumstance prevents your son/daughter from attending. As with the normal school year, if your child is not going to be at school it is important that you call the office to inform them of your child's absence. **We do not call families if their child is absent from Summer School, like we do during the school year.**
- Please use the form on the last page of this booklet to record your child's classes and return to the School Office by May 16th, 2014.
- Course offerings are open to all residents of the Silver Lake-Salem Joint School District #1 and students attending Riverview School through the Open Enrollment program. Non-resident students may register after April 21st, and a \$25 fee per class will be added to EACH class plus any additional course material fees, which may apply. Non-residents will be accommodated on a space available basis.
- The Silver Lake-Salem Joint District #1 does not discriminate against pupils on the basis of sex, religion, race, national origin, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation, or physical, emotional or learning disability or handicap in its educational programs.
- All classes are filled on a first come, first serve basis using enrollment forms with full payment included. You will be contacted if the course you register for is full.
